tool to resist misrecognition without having to rely on a positive substantive conception of recognition furthermore contrary to the neo hegelian approach it is able to address practices of misrecognition that have as an object people who are not part of the national linguistic political community the book s narrative follows a chronological order in which discourses and theories about latin america are placed in their historical context and examined in search of rhetorical strategies that perpetuate forms of misrecognition in the end feres jr demonstrates that long standing north american pejorative perceptions about the peoples and countries seen as latin american found abundantly in everyday language survive in social scientific discourse despite the reiterated claims of objectivity and value neutrality of the social sciences
